NATIONAL SERVICE CALL-UP—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF PAPER.—Mr. McMahon (Minister for Labour and National Service), by leave, made a ministerial statement with reference to certain procedures operating in connection with the call-up for national service, and, by command of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth, presented the following paper:—

Clause 6, page 3, proposed section 109A, after sub-section (2.) insert the following sub-section:-

"(2A.) Where an application is made for an order under paragraph (a) of sub-section (1.) of the last preceding section in relation to a breach or non-observance of an award and application is made at the same time under paragraph (b) of that sub-section in relation to a breach or non-observance of that award of the same or of a similar kind, the preceding provisions of this section do not apply.".

Bill, as amended, agreed to.
