- MEAT RESEARCH BILL 1965.—Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry), pursuant to notice, presented
 a Bill for an Act to amend the Cattle and Beef Research Act 1960-1964.
 Bill read a first time.

Mr. Adermann moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr. Pollard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

6. LIVE-STOCK SLAUGHTER LEVY BILL 1965.—Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Live-stock Slaughter Levy Act 1964.

Bill read a first time.

Mr. Adermann moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr. Pollard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

7. MEAT INDUSTRY BILL 1965.—Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend section 31 of the *Meat Industry Act* 1964, and for purposes connected therewith. Bill read a first time.

Mr. Adermann moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

- Debate adjourned (Mr. Pollard), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 8. MATRIMONIAL CAUSES BILL 1965.—Mr. Snedden (Attorney-General), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Matrimonial Causes Act* 1959.

Bill read a first time.

Mr. Snedden moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

- Debate adjourned (Mr. Whitlam), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 9. APPROPRIATION BILL (No. 1) 1965-66.—The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.
