Mr. Holt, Mr. Whitlam and Mr. McEwen (Minister for Trade and Industry), by leave, also made statements in connexion with the matter.  
Mr. Uren asked leave to make a statement in connexion with the matter.  
Objection being raised, leave not granted.  
*Suspension of standing orders moved.*—Mr. Calwell moved, That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent Mr. Uren making a statement.  
Debate ensued.  
Motion withdrawn, by leave.
