THURSDAY, 7 MAY 1970

- 1 The House met, at ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Sir William Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 PETITIONS: Mr Whittorn presented a petition from certain citizens of the Division of Balaclava praying that the export of products made from kangaroos be banned and that legislation be passed to make the kangaroo a protected animal throughout Australia.
 - Mr Dobie presented a petition from certain residents of New South Wales praying that the export of all kangaroo products be banned immediately.

Petitions severally received and read.

- Similar petitions to that presented by Mr Dobie were presented by Mr MacKellar, Mr Mackay and Mr Turner, and by Mr Chipp (Minister for Customs and Excise) and Mr Garrick, from certain residents of Victoria, and were severally received.
- Mr Morrison presented a petition from certain electors of the Division of St George praying that the Australian Government take positive action as soon as possible to re-establish confidence in the Commonwealth arbitration system. Petition received and read.

A similar petition to that presented by Mr Morrison was presented by Mr MacKellar, from certain electors of the Division of Warringah, and was received.

- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE—REPORT—STATEMENT BY MEMBER: Mr Dobie (Chairman) brought up the following report from the Joint Committee of Public Accounts: One hundred and sixteenth Report-Treasury Minutes on the One hundredth and One hundred and ninth Reports together with summaries of those reportsand, by leave, made a statement in connection with the report.
 - Ordered-That the report be printed.
- 5 DEFENCE FORCES RETIREMENT BENEFITS BILL 1970: Mr Bury (Treasurer), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act relating to Retirement Benefits for Members of the Defence Force.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Bury moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

- Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 6 SEAMEN'S COMPENSATION BILL 1970: Mr Sinclair (Minister for Shipping and Transport), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to increase certain amounts of Compensation payable to Seamen.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Sinclair moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

- Debate adjourned (Mr Jones), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 7 BOOK BOUNTY BILL 1970: Mr Chipp (Minister for Customs and Excise), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Book Bounty Act 1969 in relation to Books produced for or on behalf of the Commonwealth or a State.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Chipp moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

- 8 SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS—EXTENDED TIME FOR GRIEVANCE DEBATE: Mr Chipp (Minister for Customs and Excise) moved, by leave—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent the consideration of order of the day No. 1, government business (Grievance debate), being continued until one o'clock p.m. Question—put and passed.
- 9 GRIEVANCE DEBATE: Pursuant to the provisions of standing order 106, the order of the day having been read—

Question proposed—That grievances be noted. Debate ensued. It being one o'clock p.m., the debate was interrupted. Ouestion—That grievances be noted—put and passed.

10 NATIONAL HEALTH BILL 1970: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Hayden, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not opposing the Bill because it represents some improvement this House is of opinion that a National Health Insurance Commission financed from graduated contributions would pay for medical and hospital services for all more equitably and economically"—

Debate resumed.

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put. The House divided (the Speaker, Sir William Aston, in the Chair)—

12 ADJOURNMENT: Mr McEwen (Acting Prime Minister) moved—That the House do now adjourn.
