No. 12.—Quarantine Bill (continued).—Clause 75 (as amended):—

75.—(1) A quarantine officer may in the case of small-pox require any person subject to quarantine or performing quarantine to be vaccinated, and any person so required to be vaccinated shall submit to be vaccinated accordingly.

Penalty: Five pounds.

(2) A quarantine officer shall not require any person to be vaccinated unless in his opinion vaccination is necessary for the protection of persons subject to quarantine or performing quarantine, or for the prevention of the spread of any quarantinable disease the disease of small-pox.
