FRIDAY, 13TH SEPTEMBER, 1907.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPERS.—Mr. Mauger presented, pursuant to the direction of an Act of Parliament—
Public Service Act—Regulations Amended, Nos. 66 (Provisional) and 102—Statutory Rules
1907, Nos. 89 and 92.
3. WAYS AND MEANS.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.
Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. McDonald reported that the Committee had made progress and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.
