TUESDAY, 26TH NOVEMBER, 1907.

- The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PETITION.—Mr. Tilley Brown presented a Petition from the Wilberforce Gold-Dredging Company No Liability, Victoria, under its common seal, praying that the House will grant an exemption or rebate of the proposed duty, amounting to over £250, on a portable engine ordered from England by the said company, such engine being required of a type and size never made in Australia. Petition received and read.
3. WAYS AND MEANS.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.
