- 2. Want of Confidence in the Government.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Fisher:—That the Government does not possess the confidence of this House—
 Debate resumed.
 - Mr. Wilks addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.
 - Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
- 3. Adjournment.—Mr. Joseph Cook moved, That the House do now adjourn.
 - Debate ensued.
 - Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
- And then the House, at six minutes past eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
