MONDAY, 6TH DECEMBER, 1909.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. SUPPLY [ESTIMATES].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply. Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. McDonald reported that the Committee had made progress, and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again. Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Deakin having announced with deep regret the death of the honorable Member for Hindmarsh (the Honorable James Hutchison)—moved, That the House do now adjourn. And Mr. Fisher and Mr. Speaker having addressed the House— Question (all honorable Members standing)—put and resolved in the affirmative.

And then the House, at three minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at eleven o'clock a.m.
