- 1 The House met, at 2.15 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable B. M. Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petitions: The Clerk announced that the following Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Mr Bowen, Mr Connolly, Dr Edwards, Mr Ellicott, Mr Gillard, Sir William McMahon and Mr Wentworth—from certain citizens praying that that part of a deceased person's estate which passes to the surviving spouse be free from federal estate duty.
 - Mr Anthony, Mr Birney, Mr Bowen, Mr Connolly, Mr Hunt and Mr Keating—from certain citizens praying for a guarantee of interim funding for, and a review of the position of, non-State business colleges and the reversal of the decision withdrawing financial assistance from students of such colleges.
 - Mr Jarman and Mr Wentworth—from certain citizens praying that the imperial system of weights and measures be restored.
 - Mr MacKellar and Mr Ruddock—from certain citizens praying that the Broadcasting and Television Act be amended in relation to program standards.
 - Mr Sinclair and Mr West—from certain volunteer firemen of the New South Wales Fire Brigade Service praying that income tax relief be provided on the earnings of N.S.W. volunteer firemen.
 - Dr Edwards—from certain citizens praying that private nursing homes be subsidised to allow pensioner patients to retain \$6 per week for personal use and that certain other action be taken in connection with pensioner benefits.

 - Mr Innes—from certain citizens praying that the mining, selling and export of uranium not be permitted.
 - Mr L. R. Johnson—from certain citizens praying that the income tax law be amended to allow for claims for sullage removal expenses.
 - Sir William McMahon—from certain citizens praying that attention be given to the inadequate provision of English classes for migrants.
 - Mr Thomson—from certain Citizen Band radio operators praying for the relaxation of regulations governing the operation of Citizen Band radio.
 - Mr Wentworth—from certain electors praying that all matters of importance before the House be determined before its dissolution.
