1 The House met, at 2.49 p.m., according to the terms of the resolution of 5 April last. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable Sir Billy Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

2 DEATH OF MEMBER (THE HONOURABLE F. E. STEWART): Mr Fraser (Prime Minister) referred to the death of the Honourable F. E. Stewart, and moved—That this House expresses its deep regret at the death, on 16 April 1979, of the Honourable Francis Eugene Stewart, a Member of this House for the Division of Lang from 1953 to 1977 and for the Division of Grayndler since 1977, and a Minister of the Crown from 1972 to 1975; and that this House places on record its appreciation of his long and meritorious public service and tenders its profound sympathy to his widow and family in their bereavement.

And Mr Hayden (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and Mr Anthony (Leader of the National Country Party of Australia) and other Members having addressed the House in support thereof, and all Members present having risen, in silence—

Question—passed.

3 ADJOURNMENT AS A MARK OF RESPECT: Mr Fraser (Prime Minister), as a mark of respect to the memory of the late Mr F. E. Stewart, then moved—That the House do now adjourn.

Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at 4.01 p.m., adjourned until tomorrow at 2.15 p.m.
