- 1 The House met, at 3 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable Sir Billy Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petitions: The Clerk announced that the following Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Mr Anthony, Mr J. J. Brown, Mr Hunt, Mr James, Dr Klugman, Mr Neil, Mr O'Keefe and Mr West—from certain residents of New South Wales praying that the 1980 level of education expenditure to Government schools be restored and increased in real terms.
 - Mr Hodges, Mr Humphreys, Mr B. O. Jones and Mr Morris—from certain citizens praying that the Government provide certain information concerning the fishing agreement with the Japanese Government and not re-issue licences to Japanese fishermen in 1980.
 - Mr Cairns, Mr Martyr and Mr Shipton—from certain citizens praying that the National Women's Advisory Council be abolished.
 - Dr Edwards, Mr Jarman and Mr Yates—from certain citizens praying that a humane policy be adopted to assist refugees to enter Australia.
 - Mr E. C. Cameron and Mr Nixon—from certain citizens praying for the abolition of the export parity pricing policy for LPG consumed in Australia and that certain other action be taken in relation to the pricing of LPG.

7 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—TECHNOLOGICAL CHANGES IN EMPLOY-MENT: Mr Speaker informed the House that Mr Young had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The failure of the Government to understand and deal with technological changes taking place in employment".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—

Mr Young addressed the House.

Discussion ensued.

Discussion concluded.

8 SOCIAL SERVICES AMENDMENT BILL 1979: The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.

Clauses 1 to 16, by leave, taken together.

On the motion of Mr Adermann (Minister for Veterans' Affairs), by leave, the following amendments were made together, after debate:

Clause 14—

Page 5, line 9, omit "31 October 1979", insert "the date of commencement of this section".

Page 5, line 13, omit "31 October 1979", insert "the date of commencement of this section".

Clause 16-

Page 6, line 12, omit "31 October 1979", insert "the date of commencement of this section".

Page 6, line 16, omit "31 October 1979", insert "the date of commencement of this section".

Clauses, as amended, agreed to.

Remainder of Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and debated.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr Jarman reported accordingly.

Ordered—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said committee.

- 9 PRIVILEGE—STATEMENT BY MR SPEAKER: Mr Speaker referred to the matter raised earlier this day by Mr Howe as a matter of privilege concerning the alleged refusal of the Secretary of the Department of the Treasury to provide certain information to the Standing Committee on Environment and Conservation and stated that in his opinion no prima facie case of breach of privilege existed.
- 10 POSTPONEMENT OF ORDERS OF THE DAY: Ordered—That orders of the day Nos. 2 to 4, government business, be postponed until a later hour this day.
- 11 NATIONAL COMPANIES AND SECURITIES COMMISSION BILL 1979: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—
 - Debate resumed by Mr Bowen (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not opposing the Bill, the House—
 - (a) expresses its concern at the Government's apparent abdication of its responsibility to make national laws for corporations and the securities industry pursuant to the Commonwealth's own constitutional powers, and in accordance with the recommendations of the Senate Select Committee on Securities and Exchange in 1974 (the Rae Report);
 - (b) notes that the proposed legislative scheme places uniformity before reform, and creates both the danger and the likelihood that lowest common denominator standards will prevail;
 - (c) expresses its concern at the lack of effective accountability of the proposed Commission to either the Government or Parliament of the Commonwealth, or to any other single elected Government or Parliament;
 - (d) expresses its view that the Bill should be improved by redrafting it to provide for—
 (i) an extension of the scope and enforceability of its financial interest provisions;
 - (ii) a requirement that hearings of the Commission be normally held in public;
 - (iii) the establishment of the proposed Companies and Securities Law Review Committee on a firm statutory basis;
 - (iv) the establishment on a firm statutory basis of an Accounting Standards Review Committee; and
 - (v) the explicit prescription of the matters on which the Commission must annually report;
 - (e) while acknowledging that pursuant to the scheduled Agreement any such proposed amendment may need to be the subject of consultation with the Ministerial Council before final acceptance by the Government, nonetheless insists upon this Parliament's right to properly scrutinise and amend all legislation put before it by the Executive; and
 - (f) calls upon the Government, in the event of the breakdown for any reason of the scheme embodied in the Bill, to immediately proceed to the introduction of Commonwealth legislation for the national regulation of corporations and the securities industry".

Debate continued.

13 NATIONAL COMPANIES AND SECURITIES COMMISSION BILL 1979: The House, according to order, again resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.

In the committee

Clause 19—

Mr Bowen (Deputy Leader of the Opposition), by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 11, line 3, after "he" insert "his spouse or a dependent child".

Page 11, line 4, omit "a relevant interest", substitute "any interest, whether direct or indirect".

Page 11, line 6, after "local government authority" insert "or is entitled to, or in receipt of, any benefit or income, whether direct or indirect, from a body corporate".

Page 11, sub-clause (2), omit paragraph (b).

Page 11, after sub-clause (2) insert the following sub-clause:

"(2A) For the purposes of sub-section (2) a dependent child of a person is—

(a) a child adopted since the marriage by the person or by his spouse or by either of them with the consent of the other;

(b) a child of the person and his spouse born before the marriage;

(c) a child of either the person or his spouse (including an ex-nuptial child of either of them and a child adopted by either of them) if, at the relevant time, the child was ordinarily a member of the household of the person; and

(d) a child of the person under the age of 15 years; or

(e) a child under the age of 2! years who is ordinarily a member of the household of the person, or who is engaged in a course of full-time study at an educational institution.".

Page 11, line 18, omit "he shall", substitute "it shall be an offence if he does not". Page 11, at the end of sub-clause (5) add "Penalty: \$5,000 or imprisonment for 1 year, or both".

Page 11, at the end of sub-clause (6) add "Penalty for non-compliance: \$5,000 or imprisonment for 1 year, or both".

Page 11, after sub-clause (6) insert the following sub-clause:

"(6A) It shall be an offence if a person who is, or becomes a member, causes written particulars to be delivered to the responsible officer where those particulars are known by the person to be false or misleading.

Penalty: \$10,000 or imprisonment for 2 years or both.".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clauses 20 to 35, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Clause 36-

Mr Bowen, by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 17, sub-clause (2), omit all words after "Commission" (second occurring), substitute "shall direct that the hearing take place in public unless the Commission is satisfied that the holding of the hearing in public would, or would be reasonably likely to—

- (a) prejudice the investigation of a breach or possible breach of the law or the enforcement or proper administration of the law in a particular instance;
- (b) prejudice the fair trial of a person or the impartial adjudication of a particular case:
- (c) disclose, or enable a person to ascertain, the identity of a confidential source

of information in relation to the enforcement or administration of the law;

(d) disclose methods or procedures for preventing, detecting, investigating, or dealing with matters arising out of, breaches or evasions of the law, the disclosure of which would, or would be reasonably likely to, prejudice the effectiveness of those methods or procedures;

(e) endanger the lives or physical safety of persons engaged in or in connexion

with law enforcement; or

(f) unreasonably disclose information relating to the personal affairs of any person, in any of which cases the Commissioner may direct that the hearing take place in private.".

Page 17, lines 19 and 20, omit "by reason of the confidential nature of any evidence or matter, or for any other reason", substitute "by virtue of a reason specified in sub-section (2)".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clause 37—

Mr Bowen moved the following amendment: Page 18, line 15, after "documents (if any)" insert "or such class of documents".

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clauses 38 to 43, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Proposed new clause-

Mr Bowen moved—That the following new clause be inserted in the Bill:

"43A. There is established by this Act a Companies and Securities Companies and Law Review Committee which shall carry out research and advise the Review Review Ministerial Council on law reform to the legislation and regulations Committee provided for by the agreement.".

Debate ensued.

Proposed new clause negatived.

Clause 44 agreed to.

Proposed new clauses-

Mr Jacobi, by leave, moved-That the following new clauses be inserted in the Bill:

"44A. There is established by this Act an Accounting Standards Review Accounting Committee which shall conduct research and advise the Ministerial Standards Review Council on the setting of adequate standards to ensure that the true and Committee fair view of the position of a company is reflected in the accounts of the company, and to ensure adequate protection to persons who deal with the company.

"44B. For the purpose of the performance of the functions of the Staff, &c., for Accounting Standards Review Committee the Commission shall provide Standards to the Committee such staff and facilities as are approved by the Review Committee Ministerial Council.".

Debate ensued.

Proposed new clauses negatived.

Clauses 45 to 47, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Clause 48-

Mr Bowen, by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 26, lines 9 and 10, omit "information that is not generally available but, if it were, would be likely materially to affect the price of any securities", substitute "information relating to any securities".

Page 26, after sub-clause (1) insert the following sub-clause:

"(1A) It is a defence to a prosecution for an offence against sub-section (1) if it is established to the satisfaction of the Court that the information to which the prosecution relates was generally available.".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Mr Bowen moved the following amendment: Page 26, at the end of sub-clause (5) add "or after the expiration of 1 year after the date of a conviction under sub-section (1) in respect of the transaction in which the loss occurred, whichever date is the later in time".

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr Bowen, by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 26, line 40, after "name" insert "or names".

Page 26, line 41, after "person" insert "or persons".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clause 49—

Mr Bowen, by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 27, line 10, omit "a relevant interest", substitute "any interest".

Page 27, line 11, omit "a relevant interest", substitute "any interest".

Page 27, lines 12 and 13, omit "a relevant interest", substitute "any interest".

Page 27, line 40, omit "whether a person has a relevant interest in securities,".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clauses 50 and 51, by leave, taken together, and agreed to.

Clause 52—

Mr Bowen, by leave, moved the following amendments together:

Page 28, line 32, omit "in such form as the Ministerial Council approves".

Page 28, after sub-clause (1) insert the following sub-clause:

- "(1A) In its annual report the Commission shall, so far as practicable, also report on—
- (a) any recommendations made to the Ministerial Council by the Companies and Securities Law Review Committee:
- (b) any recommendations made to the Ministerial Council by the Accounting Standards Review Committee;
- (c) any recommendations made to the Ministerial Council by the Commission pursuant to sub-section 6 (3); and
- (d) any reports made to the Ministerial Council by the Commission pursuant to section 8.".

Debate continued.

Amendments negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Remainder of Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.
