 - Mr O'Keefe—from certain citizens praying that the National Women's Advisory Council be maintained and Federal Government support for its activities be increased.
 - Mr Porter—from certain citizens praying for the implementation of certain recommendations of the Report of the Senate Standing Committee on Social Welfare, entitled *Drug Problems in Australia—An intoxicated Society?*
