 - Mr Blunt and Mr Newman—from certain citizens praying that regulations amending the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations and Customs (Cinematograph Films) Regulations and the ordinance superseding the ACT Objectionable Publications Ordinance be disallowed and certain other action be taken in relation to censorship matters.
 - Mr Cadman and Mr Rocher—from certain citizens praying that chiropractic services be included in Medicare when it is introduced.
 - Mrs Darling and Mr Moore—from certain residents of Queensland praying that no action be taken to change the national flag.

3 ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER HERITAGE (INTERIM PROTECTION)

Clause 10, page 5, line 29, after "proprietary", insert "or pecuniary".

Clause 12, page 6, line 15, after "proprietary", insert "or pecuniary".

Clause 22—

Page 10, lines 12-14, omit "knows, or ought reasonably to know, of the existence of a declaration made under Part II in relation to a significant Aboriginal area and contravenes a provision of that declaration", substitute "contravenes a provision of a declaration made under Part II in relation to a significant Aboriginal area".

Page 10, lines 19-21, omit "knows, or ought reasonably to know, of the existence of a declaration made under Part II in relation to a significant Aboriginal object or significant Aboriginal objects and contravenes a provision of that declaration", substitute "contravenes a provision of a declaration made under Part II in relation to a significant Aboriginal object or significant Aboriginal objects".

Clause 24, page 11, omit sub-clause (3), substitute the following sub-clause:

"(3) In proceedings for an offence referred to in sub-section 23 (1), where there is evidence that, at the relevant time, the defendant neither knew, nor had reasonable grounds for knowing, of the existence of the declaration alleged to have been contravened, the defendant shall not be committed for trial or convicted unless the prosecution proves that, at that time, the defendant knew, or ought reasonably to have known, of the existence of the declaration."

Clause 30, page 13, line 29, after "proprietary", insert "or pecuniary".

New clause—

Page 14, after clause 30, insert the following new clause in Part IV:

Delegation

- "30A. (1) The Minister may, either generally or as otherwise provided in the instrument of delegation, by writing signed by him, delegate to a person all or any of his powers and functions under this Act (other than sections 9, 10 and 12, sub-section 13 (2) and section 26), the regulations, or a declaration, other than this power of delegation.
- "(2) A power or function delegated under this section, when exercised or performed by the delegate, shall, for the purposes of this Act, the regulations or the declaration, as the case may be, be deemed to have been exercised or performed by the Minister.
- "(3) A delegation under this section does not prevent the exercise of a power or performance of a function by the Minister.
- "(4) In this section, 'declaration' means a declaration made under Part II"
