Fischer (Leader of the National Party of Australia) had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The urgent requirement for an immediate decision from the Government to approve the Coronation Hill project and bring to an end the lengthy politicisation and procrastination over this important project which is now a litmus test".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—Mr T. A. Fischer addressed the House.
