- 1 The House met, at 10 a.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (the Honourable Leo McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 PRIME MINISTER AND CABINET LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL 1991: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Howard, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not declining to give the Bill a second reading, the House deplores the Government's failure to acknowledge Commonwealth employees' freedom to associate, and the Government's failure to capture the productivity improvements to be had from enterprise bargaining within the federal Public Service by:

(1) proscribing compulsory membership of trade unions;

(2) proscribing preference for trade unionists in awards and federal legislation;

(3) abolishing automatic deduction of union dues within Commonwealth departments and authorities; and

(4) giving the chief executive officers of Commonwealth departments and statutory authorities the same responsibility as their private sector counterparts in deciding the size, composition, deployment, pay and conditions of employees, subject only to a budget constraint"—

Debate resumed.
