# WEDNESDAY, 4 MARCH 1992

- 1 The House met, at 10 a.m., pursuant to adjournment.
- 2 ABSENCE OF SPEAKER: The Clerk having informed the House that the Speaker (the Honourable Leo McLeay) was absent until later this day, the Chairman of Committees (Mr R. F. Edwards) took the Chair as Acting Speaker, and read Prayers.
- 3 CHILD SUPPORT LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL 1992: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—
  That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Mr Burr dissenting.

Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Baldwin (Minister Assisting the Treasurer), the Bill was read a third time.

4 SOCIAL SECURITY AND VETERANS' AFFAIRS LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL 1992: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr Braithwaite who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not declining to give the Bill a second reading, the House notes that the Government's family allowance proposal is little more than a one-off electoral gimmick—albeit a very costly one—which pales into insignificance when compared to the Coalition's 'Fightback' proposal for substantial and permanent increases".

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Question—That the Bill be now read a second time—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Message No. 239, dated 3 March 1992, from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Dr Blewett (Minister for Social Security), the Bill was read a third time.

5 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice being asked—

Suspension of standing and sessional orders—Motion of censure of Treasurer: Mr Reith (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) moved—That so much of the standing and sessional orders be suspended as would prevent the Deputy Leader of the Opposition moving forthwith—That this House censures the Treasurer for his role in the Government's attempt to grossly distort the benefits provided to Australians by the Coalition's "Fightback" package.

Question—put and passed, with the concurrence of an absolute majority. Treasurer—Motion of censure: Mr Reith moved—That this House censures the Treasurer for his role in the Government's attempt to grossly distort the benefits provided to Australians by the Coalition's "Fightback" package. Mr Dawkins (Treasurer) moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "this House censures the Opposition for:

(1) its disgraceful and unjustified attacks upon important public institutions; (2) its misleading and incompetently costed 'Fightback' package;

(3) its advocacy of a package which massively disadvantages low income earners but benefits high income earners;

(4) its advocacy of a medical system which would place the health of the bulk of the Australian population hostage to their purse;

(5) its failure to address the employment, education and training needs of

Australia's young people;
(6) its deceitful estimates of employment growth under its proposition;
(7) its deliberate persecution of those who are social security and unemployment beneficiaries;

(8) its failure to address the infrastructure requirements of microeconomic

reform programs; and

(9) its complete failure to review business taxation on investment critical to encouraging employment creating growth". Debate continued.

Question—That the amendment be agreed to—put.

8 OZONE PROTECTION AMENDMENT BILL 1992: Mrs Kelly (Minister for the Arts, Sport, the Environment and Territories), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Ozone Protection Act 1989, and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mrs Kelly moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Paper: Mrs Kelly presented an explanatory memorandum to the Bill.

9 SALES TAX LAWS AMENDMENT BILL (NO. 1) 1992: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time-

Debate resumed by Mr Rocher who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "while not opposing the passage of the Bill, the House notes that the Bill adds further complexity to an already complex wholesale sales tax system and calls on the Government to abolish this ramshackle system and replace it with an efficient and more equitable goods and services tax".

Debate continued.

10 ADJOURNMENT: It being 7.30 p.m.—The question was proposed—That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

The House continuing to sit until 8 p.m.—The Deputy Speaker adjourned the House until tomorrow at 9.30 a.m.
