WEDNESDAY, 9TH NOVEMBER, 1910.

- The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the
 Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Emigration Bill.—Mr. Batchelor moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act relating to the Emigration from Australia of Young Persons and Aboriginal Natives.

 Question—put and passed.
 - Mr. Batchelor then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.
 - Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.
 - Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
- 3. LAND TAX ASSESSMENT BILL—SENATE'S AMENDMENTS.—The Order of the Day having been read for the consideration in Committee of the whole House of the Amendments made by the Senate in this Bill—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

The Committee proceeded to consider the amendments, which are as follow:-

SCHEDULE OF THE AMENDMENTS MADE BY THE SENATE.

- No. 1.—Page 3, clause 3, line 15, leave out "Taxes", insert "Land Tax".
- No. 2.—Page 3, clause 4, line 17, leave out "Taxes", insert "Land Tax".
- No. 3.—Page 4, clause 8, line 20, after "powers" insert "or functions".
- No. 4.—Page 4, clause 8, line 21, after "powers" insert "or functions".

 - "8A.—(1.) The Commissioner shall furnish to the Treasurer Report by annually, for presentation to the Parliament, a report on the working Commissioner. of this Act.

- No. 7.—Page 5, clause 11, lines 4 and 5, leave out "after the thirtieth day of June, but".
- No. 8.—Page 5, clause 12, lines 23 and 24, leave out "under a State Act relating to building societies", insert "as a building society under any Act or State Act".
- No. 9.—Page 5, clause 12, paragraph (g), after sub-paragraph (2) insert the following new sub-paragraph:—
 - "(2A) a building owned and occupied by a masonic society, or by a club or association of members of a trade or profession, not carried on for pecuniary profit;"
- No. 10.—Page 7, clause 17, lines 4 and 5, leave out "and entered in assessment registers in the prescribed manner".
- No. 11.—Page 7, clause 18, line 15, leave out "and enter".
- No. 12.—Page 7, clause 19, line 30, leave out "register".
- No. 13.—Page 8, clause 21, line 7, leave out "or assessment register".
- No. 14.—Page 8, clause 22, lines 10 and 11, leave out "register, or of any entry made therein".
- No. 15.—Page 8, clause 22, line 12, leave out "or extract from the register", insert "an assessment".
- No. 16.—Page 8, clause 22, line 22, leave out "register".
- No. 17.—Page 8, clause 23, line 26, leave out "and entered in an assessment register".

No. 18.—Page 8, clause 24, at end of clause add the following new sub-clause: "(2.) In this section 'tenant for life' includes-Cf. 45-6 Vic. c. 38. (a) a tenant for the life of another; (b) a tenant for his own or any other life whose estate is liable to cease in any event during that life; (c) a person entitled to the income of land under a trust or direction for payment thereof to him during his own or any other life." No. 19.—Page 9, clause 27, line 20, after "who" insert "or whose predecessor in title". No. 20.—Page 9, clause 27, line 26, after "made" insert "or agreed to be made". No. 21.—Page 9, clause 27, line 30, after "Act" insert "entered into an agreement to make No. 22.—Page 10, clause 28, line 11, after "lands" insert "or relating to mining".

No. 23.—Page 10, clause 29, line 15, after "lease" insert "or agreement for a lease".

No. 24.—Page 10, clause 29, line 18, after "lease" insert "or agreement". No. 25.—Page 10, clause 29, line 24, after "lease" insert "or agreement". No. 26.—Page 11, clause 32, lines 10 and 11, leave out "by reason of joint occupation or otherwise", insert "for any reason". No. 27.—Page 11, clause 32, lines 16 and 17, leave out "by reason of joint occupation" or for any other", insert "for any". No. 28.—Page 11, clause 32, leave out the last proviso, lines 33-45, insert the following new sub-clause: "(2.) A trustee shall in no case be deemed to be an absentee; but any of the beneficiaries who are absentees shall be separately assessed and liable as absentees." No. 29.—Page 11, after clause 32 insert the following new clause:— "32A. Where under a settlement made before the first day of July, Under charged with annuity of a testator who died before that day, land is charged with an annuity—

"32A. Where under a settlement made before the first day of July, Land charged with annuity under settlement of will before that day, land is charged with an annuity—

"32A. Where under a settlement made before the first day of July, Land charged with annuity under settlement of will before the first day of July, 1910. (a) the value of the annuity shall be calculated according to the prescribed tables for the calculation of values; and (b) there shall be deducted from the unimproved value of the land a sum which bears the same proportion to the value of the annuity as the unimproved value of the land bears to its improved value." No. 30.—Page 14, clause 39, lines 20 and 21, leave out "and shall not be deemed to be occupied by them jointly". No. 31.—Page 22, clause 64, line 27, leave out "roll". Amendments Nos. 1 to 8 agreed to, after debate. Amendment No. 9 read. On the motion of Mr. Hughes the amendment was amended as follows, after debate:-Line 1, omit "masonic" and omit "or by a". Mr. Fenton moved the following further amendment:-Line 1, omit "club". Debate ensued. Question—That the word proposed to be omitted stand part of the amendment—put. The Committee divided-Noes 12
