VOTES AND **PROCEEDINGS**

REPRESENTATIVES HOUSE OF

WEDNESDAY, 1st NOVEMBER, 1911.

- 1. The House met at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Conciliation and Arbitration Bill (1911).—The Order of the Day having been read for the third reading-Mr. Hughes moved, That the Bill be now read a third time. Question—put and passed.—Bill read a third time.
- 3. Lighthouses Bill.—The Order of the Day having been read for the third reading—Mr. Hughes, for Mr. Tudor, moved, That the Bill be now read a third time. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a third time.

4. Commonwealth Bank Bill .-- Mr. Fisher, pursuant to an Order made on the 31st ultimo, brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to provide for a Commonwealth Bank," and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.

5. Paper.—Mr. Tudor presented, pursuant to Statute—

Customs Act-Regulation re Maximum Weight of Packages of Wheat, &c., for Inter-State Transfer.—Statutory Rules 1911, No. 168.

6. Supply [Estimates-Additions, New Works, Buildings, etc., 1911-12].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

Question again proposed (see p. 86 ante)-That the first item in the Estimates, under Division I.-The Parliament-namely-

> The President ... £1,100

be agreed to.

Ordered, on the motion of Mr. Fisher, after debate-That the consideration of the General Estimates be postponed until after the consideration of the Estimates for Additions, New Works, Buildings, &c.

Additions, New Works, Buildings, etc., 1911-12.

Division No. 1. Subdivision No. 1.

Motion made, That Item No. 1, £35,053, be agreed to.

Debate ensued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Poynton reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
