- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PETITIONS.—Mr. Mahon presented five Petitions from certain adult white people, residents of, or having an interest in, Papua, praying that the House will amend Clause 286 of the Navigation Bill so that the Territory of Papua will not come within its operation. Petitions received and one of them read.

Mr. Mahon moved, That the Petitions be printed.

Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.

4. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered, That the consideration of other Business be postponed until after the consideration of Order of the Day No. 2.

5. OBJECTION TO RULING OF MR. SPEAKER.—The Order of the Day having been read for the consideration of the motion, by Mr. Higgs at the last sitting, to dissent from a ruling of Mr. Speaker—That Mr. Speaker's ruling that the amendment of the Member for Grey (Mr. Poynton) is in order be disagreed to on the ground that said amendment is the same in substance as the amendment moved by the Member for Gwydir (Mr. Webster) and defeated on the voices. Debate ensued.

Question—put and negatived.

6. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered, That the consideration of Notices of Motion, General Business, Nos. 1 to 6 inclusive be postponed until after the consideration of Notice of Motion No. 7.

- 7. IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION BILL (1912).—Mr. Fowler moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the *Immigration Restriction Act* 1901-1910, so as to give increased power to the Minister for External Affairs to deport criminals. Question—put and passed.
- 8. PANAMA CANAL DUES-REBATE TO AMERICAN SHIPPING.-Mr. Kelly moved, pursuant to notice, That, in the opinion of this House-
 - (1) Any system of bonus or rebate of canal dues to American shipping using the Panama Canal would be detrimental to the interests of Australia.
 - (2) That the above resolution be transmitted to the Senate for its concurrence.

Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.

9. MINISTERS' TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.—Mr. Palmer's notice of motion, "That a Return be laid upon the Table of the House showing the amount paid to Ministers of the Crown for travelling allowances during the recess, and, in detail, the amounts paid to each Minister," having been called on—Mr. W. Elliot Johnson moved, That the Notice of Motion be postponed. Question—That the Notice of Motion be postponed—put and negatived.

And no Member moving the motion on the Paper, it lapsed under Standing Order No. 102.

10. TROPICAL PORTIONS OF AUSTRALIA—ROYAL COMMISSION.—Mr. McWilliams moved, pursuant to notice, That a Royal Commission, consisting of Members of this House, be appointed to inquire into and report upon the most prompt and effective methods of developing the natural resources of the tropical portions of Australia, and of establishing therein a permanent population. Debate ensued.

The time allowed for precedence to General Business having terminated, Government Business was called on.

- 11. POSTFONEMENT OF BUSINESS.—Ordered, That the consideration of Notices of Motion, Government Business, be postponed until after consideration of Order of the Day No. 1.
- 12. SUPPLY ["GRIEVANCE DAY"].—Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 241, the Order of the Day having been read for going into the Committee of Supply...
 Question proposed.—That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair.
 Debate ensued.
 Question.—put and negatived.
 Resolved.—That the House will, to-morrow, resolve itself into the said Committee.
- 13. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER.—Mr. Fisher moved, by leave, That Standing Order No. 257A be suspended for to-morrow in regard to the second reading debate on the Navigation Bill. Question—put and passed.
- 14. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Fisher moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.
- And then the House, at five minutes past eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
