- 6. Municipal Rates—Payment of, by Commonwealth.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Kelly:—That this House, following the practice of the House of Commons, is of opinion, in view of the unequal distribution of Federal properties in the various municipalities of Australia, that the Commonwealth should grant yearly to each municipality as an act of grace an amount equal to the municipal rates and taxes which it would have to pay were it not exempt from taxation under

Debate resumed.

Mr. Higgs addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

Mr. Fisher moved, That Standing Order No. 257A shall not prevent the right of reply under Standing Order No. 261.

Question—put and passed. Mr. Roberts having replied—

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
