printed and bound annually in one volume.

Resolved—That all reports, papers, &c., be referred to the Printing Committee before being printed, excepting those which have been authorized by either the Senate or House of Representatives to be printed.

Mr. McWilliams moved, by leave, That the Report be adopted. Ordered, after debate—That the Report be referred back to the Committee for reconsideration.

3. Navigation Bill.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Clauses 272 to 279 agreed to.

Clause 280 debated and agreed to.

Clause 281 agreed to.

Clause 282, after debate, amended on the motion of Mr. Tudor, by the insertion after the word "board" in line 3, page 71, of the following words:—"and after having the amount of his fare (if he has paid it) returned or tendered to him."

Clause, as amended, debated and agreed to.

Clause 283 agreed to.

Clause 284 debated and agreed to.

Clause 285, after debate, amended, on the motion of Mr. Tudor, by the omission of the proviso.

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Clause 286-

Mr. Tudor moved an amendment, That the words of the clause on page 71, and on page 72 up to and inclusive of the words "Provided further that", in line 5, be omitted from the clause. Debate ensued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Poynton reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, on Tuesday next, again resolve itself into the said Committee

4. Adjournment.—Mr. Fisher moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twelve minutes past four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
