APPROPRIATION (WORKS AND BUILDINGS) BILL 1910-11.—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and read a first time, 111. Second reading; Committee; reported without amendment, report adopted, and, by leave, Bill read a third time, 114. Returned by Senate with an amendment, 125. Mr. Speaker states his opinion that Senate's amendment is out of order; in Committee the amendment disagreed to, as it altered the destination of the Vote; report adopted, 130. Returned again by Senate insisting on its amendment, 131. Committee insists on disagreeing to amendment insisted on by Senate, but as a consequential amendment omits the whole item amended and makes the necessary alterations in the totals in the Bill; report adopted, 134. Returned again by Senate no longer insisting on its amendment and agreeing to consequential amendment of the House, &c., 138. Assented to, 154. *Act No.* 12 of 1910.

AUSTRALIAN INDUSTRIES PRESERVATION BILL (1910).—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 161. Second reading; Committee; reported with an amendment, and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill passed through remaining stages, 219. Returned by Senate with amendments; amendments considered and agreed to, 237. Assented to, 255. *Act No.* 29 of 1910.

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- BANK NOTES TAX BILL.**—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and read a first time, 52. Second reading, 68, 90. Committee; reported with an amendment; report, by leave, adopted, 90. Bill read a third time, 115. Agreed to by Senate without *requests*, 143. Assented to, 176. *Act No. 14 of 1910.*

- BANKING COMPANIES RESERVE LIABILITIES BILL (Mr. Fuller).**—Received from Senate and read a first time, 123. Second reading; time for precedence to General Business having expired, Government Business called on, 161. On motion (Mr. Fuller) resumption of debate made an Order of the Day for future date, 170. Bill read a second time; Committee, 257. (*Lapsed at Prorogation.*)

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- CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (LEGISLATIVE POWERS) BILL.**—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 146. Second reading, 179, 181, 183, 185. Amendment (Mr. Cook)—After the word "That" in the motion "That the Bill be now read a second time" insert "in the opinion of this House the industrial provisions of the Constitution should not be altered except to regulate the conditions of employment in all industries that are Federal in operation or which cannot be effectually regulated by any one State; further enabling the Inter-State Commission to prevent and remove unfair competition between the same industries carried on in different States"—debate continued; amendment negatived (on division); Bill read a second time; motion (Sir John Forrest)—"That as the inclusion in a single measure of more than one substantive amendment of the Constitution is unjust and undemocratic, as it deprives the electors of an opportunity of the expression of a free and independent judgment upon the several issues raised gravely affecting the future of Australia, it be an instruction to the Committee to divide the Bill into four Bills, so as to allow each proposed alteration to be dealt with as a separate measure"—debated—and (on division) negatived, 186. Committee, 186, 191-2, 193-4. Reported with an amendment; report, by leave, adopted, 194. Motion—That the Bill be now read a third time—carried (on division) by an absolute majority of the House, 196. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 232. (*Awaiting Referendum.*)
- CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (MONOPOLIES) BILL.**—Leave (on notice amended) given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 157. Second reading, 179. Bill read a second time (on division); Committee; reported with amendments; report, by leave, adopted, 199-200. Motion—That the Bill be now read a third time—carried (on division) by an absolute majority of the House, 201. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 233. (*Awaiting Referendum.*)
- CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (STATE DEBTS) BILL (Session 1909).**—Assented to, 63. *Act No. 3 of 1910.*
- CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (UNIFICATION) BILL (Mr. Bamford).**—(Introduced under short title "Referendum (State Constitutions Reconstruction, &c.) Bill").—Leave given to bring in Bill, 79. Brought in and read a first time, 117. (*Lapsed at Prorogation.*)

- CUSTOMS BILL (1910).**—Received from Senate and read a first time, 236. Second reading, 237, 238, 239. Committee; reported with an amendment and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill passed through remaining stages, 239-40. Amendment agreed to by Senate, 241. Assented to, 261. *Act No. 36 of 1910.*
- CUSTOMS (INTER-STATE ACCOUNTS) BILL.**—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 81. Second reading; Committee; reported without amendment; report adopted, 85. Bill read a third time, 90. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 101. Assented to, 115. *Act No. 9 of 1910.*
- CUSTOMS TARIFF BILL (1910).**—Brought in on resolution (228-32, 235) from Committee of Ways and Means; read a first time; second reading, by leave; Committee; reported with an amendment and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill passed through remaining stages, 238. Returned by Senate with *requests* for amendments; requested amendments considered in Committee and made, 251-2. Senate agrees to Bill as amended at request of Senate, 258. Assented to, 262. *Act No. 39 of 1910.*

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**DEFENCE BILL (1910).**—Received from Senate and read a first time, 104. Second reading, 223. Committee, 223-4, 225-7, 242. Reported with amendments; Standing Orders suspended to enable remaining stages to be passed without delay; motion (*Mr. Cook*) for recommitment of Bill for re-consideration of clause 9—negatived (on division); report adopted and Bill read a third time, 242. Returned by Senate agreeing to some of the amendments of the House, amending one amendment and disagreeing with another; amendments considered; Senate's amendment on an amendment agreed to, and amendment disagreed to not insisted on, 247-8. Assented to, 262. *Act No. 37 of 1910.*

Committee; reported with an amendment; by leave, report adopted, and Bill read a third time, 170. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 181. Assented to, 197. *Act No. 17 of 1910.*

**IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION [DEPORTATION OF CRIMINALS] BILL (*Mr. Fowler*).**—Leave given to bring in Bill, 104; brought in and read a first time, 121. Second reading, 175. (*Lapsed at Prorogation.*)

Second reading; Committee; reported without amendment, report adopted, and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill read a third time, 241. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 252. Assented to, 261. *Act No. 34 of 1910.*

**LAND TAX ASSESSMENT BILL.**—Leave given to bring in Bill; brought in and read a first time, 67. Second reading, 74, 99. Amendment (*Mr. Deakin*)—That after the word "That" the following words be inserted, viz.:—"the form of Land Tax outlined by the Prime Minister, and provided for in this Bill, is unjust in its incidence, and an abuse of Federal powers"—debate continued, 99, 101, 104, 105, 107, 115, 117, 119, 123, 125, 127. Amendment negatived (on division); amendment (*Mr. W. Elliot Johnson*) to insert other words negatived; Bill read a second time, 128. Committee, 128, 135, 137, 139-40, 141-3, 146-8, 149-50, 157-60, 162-3. Reported with amendments, 163. Recommended; reported with further amendments; reports, by leave, adopted, 165-7. Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 168. Governor-General's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to, 171. Motion (*Sir John Forrest*) on third reading for recommitment—negatived (on division), 171; Bill read a third time (on division), 172. Returned by Senate with amendments, 206. Amendments considered in Committee—No. 9 agreed to with amendments (after division), others agreed to; report adopted, 207-8. Amendments upon amendment No. 9 of the Senate agreed to by Senate, 211.
