## VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

FRIDAY, 26TH SEPTEMBER, 1913.

1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. ELECTORAL BILL (1913).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—  
Debate resumed.  
Mr. Dankel addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.  
Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for Tuesday next.
3. PAPER.—Mr. Groom presented, pursuant to Statute—  
Public Service Act—Promotion of Hugh McConaghy to new office of Senior Clerk to the Inter-State Commission.
4. MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE.—SUPPLY BILL (No. 3) 1913-14.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate :—  
MR. SPEAKER, *Message No. 3.*  
The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "*An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen,*" to which it has agreed without requests.
