- 2. DISTINGUISHED VISITOR.—On the motion of Mr. Joseph Cook, seconded by Mr. Fisher, His Excellency the Honorable W. L. Allardyce, C.M.G., Governor of the Falkland Islands, was provided with a seat on the floor of the House.
- 3. Message from the Senate.—Audit Bill (1913).—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate:—

Mr. Speaker,

Message No. 11.

The Senate returns to the House of Representatives the Bill for "An Act to amend the 'Audit Act 1901-1912,'" to which it has agreed with the amendment indicated in the annexed Schedule, in which amendment the Senate requests the concurrence of the House of Representatives.
