FRIDAY, 14TH NOVEMBER, 1913.

- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PAPER.—Mr. W. H. Irvine presented, pursuant to Statute— Trade Marks Act—Regulations (Provisional)—Statutory Rules 1913, No. 260.
- GOVERNMENT PREFERENCE PROHIBITION BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Mr. West addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for Tuesday next.

4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. W. H. Irvine moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at thirty-eight minutes past three o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
