1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PARLIAMENTARY STANDING COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC WORKS.—Mr. Riley, Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, brought up the following Report from the Committee—

IMPORTS FROM AND EXPORTS TO CERTAIN COUNTRIES 1914 AND 1915.—Mr. Fenton moved, pursuant to notice, That a Return be laid upon the Table of the House showing the imports into Australia from Great Britain, America, Germany, Japan, Austria, and Italy, also the exports from Australia to the countries named, for the years ended 30th September, 1914, and 30th September, 1915?

SUPPLY BILL (No. 3) 1915-16.
