- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.

WIDE BAY ELECTORAL DIVISION.—ISSUE OF WRIT.—Mr. Speaker announced to the House that he had yesterday issued a Writ for the election of a Member to serve for the Electoral Division of Wide Bay, in the State of Queensland, in the place of the Right Honorable Andrew Fisher, resigned. The dates appointed in the Writ were as follow:-

Date of Polling—Saturday, 11th December, 1915. Return of Writ—On or before Saturday, 15th January, 1916.

3. Message from the Governor-General.—War Loan Bill (1915) (No. 3).—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and the same was read by Mr. Speaker:-

Message No. 110.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to authorize the raising and expending of the sum of Eighteen million pounds for War purposes.
