- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.
- 2. ABSENCE OF MR. SPEAKER.—The Clerk at the Table having informed the House that Mr. Speaker was unavoidably absent, the Chairman of Committees took the Chair as Deputy-Speaker, and read Prayers.
- 3. Message from the Governor-General.—Assent to Supply Bill (No. 4) 1916-17. The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was received, and the same was read by Mr. Deputy-Speaker :-

A Bill intituled "An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and seventeen," as finally passed by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth, having been presented to the Governor-General for the Royal Assent, His Excellency has, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, assented to the said Act.
