HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WEDNESDAY, 30TH OCTOBER, 1918.

1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
 2. DEATH OF MEMBER (THE HONORABLE J. C. MANIFOLD).—Mr. Watt having announced, with deep regret, the death of the honorable Member for Corangamite (the Honorable James Chester Manifold), moved, by leave, That this House places upon record its high appreciation of the great public services of the late Honorable James Chester Manifold, Member for the Division of Corangamite, and tenders its sincere sympathy to the bereaved widow and relatives of an eminent citizen, whose decease is a great loss to the Commonwealth.
And Mr. Tudor having seconded the motion, and all Members present having risen, in silence—
Question—passed.
Resolved—That Mr. Speaker be requested to transmit to Mrs. Manifold the foregoing Resolution, and a copy of the speeches delivered thereon.
 3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Watt then moved, That, as a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable gentleman, the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.
