3. WAR-TIME PROFITS TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (1918) .- Mr. Watt moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the War-time Profits Tax Assessment Act 1917. Debate ensued.
