## WEDNESDAY, 1st SEPTEMBER, 1920.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—Wool "Pool."—Mr. Hughes, by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the Wool "Pool".
- 3. Papers.—The following Papers were presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—Wool "Pool"—Report of the Central Wool Committee for Season 1919-20 and Résumé of its Administration since appointment in November, 1916, and also a Financial Statement in connexion therewith.

Severally ordered, after debate, to lie on the Table, and to be printed.

4. CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL (1920).—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Debate resumed upon the motion of Mr. Gregory—That the following new clause be added to the Bill:—

19. After section fifty-eight a of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:-

"58B. The rules of an organization under this Act and the officials of such organization shall not, during the currency of an award in the industry concerned, prevent or impede any members of such organization from entering into written agreements in accordance with such award at any time prior to the commencement of service."

19. Section ninety-two of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the words "and in particular for providing for the exhibiting, on the premises of an employer bound by an award or order of the Court, of any of the terms of the award or order."

Question—put and passed.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Fleming reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
