1. The House met, at half-past eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.

 3. DEATH OF MEMBER (THE HONORABLE JAMES PAGE).—Sir Joseph Cook having announced, with deep regret, the death, that day, of the honorable Member for Maranoa (the Honorable James Page), moved, by leave, That this House records its sincere regret at the death of the honorable Member for Maranoa (the Honorable James Page), who was a Member of this House since the inauguration of the Parliament, and expresses its appreciation of the zeal with which he devoted himself to his public duties, and its profound sympathy with his bereaved family in their great sorrow.
And Mr. Ryan having seconded the motion, and other honorable Members having addressed the House in support thereof, and all Members present having risen in silence—
Question—passed.
Resolved—That Mr. Deputy-Speaker be requested to transmit to the relatives the foregoing Resolution, and a copy of the speeches delivered thereon.
 4. ADJOURNMENT.—Sir Joseph Cook, as a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable gentleman, then moved, That the House do now adjourn.
