### FRIDAY, 17th JUNE, 1921.

- 1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Ordered—That the time allowed for the debate be further extended to a quarter to four o'clock p.m. Debate continued.

Mr. Ryan, addressing the House, and not having, in compliance with Standing Order No. 39, concluded his speech within fifteen minutes, the honorable Member was, by leave of the House, allowed to continue his speech.

Debate continued.

- At a quarter to four o'clock p.m., the time allotted having expired, the debate was interrupted, and the Business of the Day was called on.
- 3. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—

War Service Homes Act-Land acquired under, at Carnegie, Victoria.

4. ADJOURNMENT.—Sir Joseph Cook moved, That the House do now adjourn.
