- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Deputy-Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Leave of Absence to Member (Mr. Lazzarini).—Mr. Charlton moved, by leave, That leave of absence for one month be given to the honorable Member for Werriwa (Mr. Lazzarini), on the ground of undergoing medical treatment.

- 3. Ocean Freights—Excessive Rates charged on Australian Products.—Mr. Jowett moved, pursuant to notice, That this House desires to direct the attention of the Right Honorable the Prime Minister of Australia to the excessive and crushing rates of ocean freights now being charged upon the exportable products of Australia. Also, that this House requests the Prime Minister to use his best endeavours to obtain the co-operation of the Imperial Government, also of the Governments of His Majesty's other Dominions, to secure a very substantial reduction upon the ocean freights now being charged upon the exportable products of His Majesty's Dominions.
 - Points of Order having been raised, and objection having been taken to the motion being treated as unopposed, it ceased to have precedence.
- 4. Papers.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—Repatriation Commission—Rulings of the Commission under the Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920, and the Regulations.
