- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT AS TO WASHINGTON CONFERENCE RE DISARMAMENT, ETC.--MOTION FOR PRINTING CABLEGRAM .-- Mr. Hughes, by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the Conference which it was proposed to hold in Washington with reference to the question of Disarmament, &c., and, in conclusion, moved, That the cablegram (from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated 3rd October, 1921, conveying the invitation of the Prime Minister of Great Britain to Australia to be represented on the British Empire Delegation at the Washington Conference) be printed.

Mr. Charlton moved, as an amendment, That all the words after the word "That" be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following words in place thereof:-

"in the opinion of this House the Disarmament Conference to be held at Washington is of vital importance, and that Australia should be represented thereat by a representative of the Government and each of the other parties, and that the decisions of such Conference should be subject to ratification by this Parliament".

The time having arrived for the interruption of the debate (in accordance with Standing Order No. 119)-

Ordered—That the debate be continued.

Question-That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question-put.
