The Committee proceeded to consider the Amendments requested by the Senate, which are as follow :---

SCHEDULE SHOWING REQUESTS MADE BY THE SENATE FOR AMENDMENTS IN THE CUSTOMS TARIFF 1921.

No. 1.-Page 4, clause 12, leave out the clause and insert the following new clause :---

"12.-(1.) The undermentioned Acts are hereby repealed, as from the time when this Act is deemed Repeat of Acts. to have come into operation, namely :----

Customs Tariff 1908 (No. 7 of 1908).

Customs Tariff Amendment 1908 (No. 13 of 1908).

Customs Tariff 1910 (No. 39 of 1910). Customs Tariff 1911 (No. 19 of 1911).

"(2.) The Customs Tariff Validation Act 1917 (No. 6 of 1917) and the Customs Tariff Validation Act 1919 (No. 17 of 1919) shall cease, as from the time when this Act is deemed to have come into operation, to apply to the demanding and collection of duties of Customs pursuant to any Tariff proposals other than the proposals relating to the Tariff on goods imported from, and the produce or manufacture of, the Union of South Africa.

"(3.) The Customs Tariff (South African Preference) 1906 (No. 17 of 1906), the Customs Tariff Validation Act 1917 (No. 6 of 1917), and the Customs Tariff Validation Act 1919 (No. 17 of 1919) are hereby repealed as from the date of assent to this Act.".
