WEDNESDAY, 9TH NOVEMBER, 1921.

- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute-

- 3. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDER OF THE DAY.—Ordered, That Order of the Day No. 1 be postponed until after Orders of the Day Nos. 2 and 3, Government Business.
- 4. Message from the Deputy of the Governor-General.—Supply Bill (No. 4) 1921-22.—The following Message from His Excellency the Deputy of the Governor-General was presented, and the same was read by Mr. Speaker:—

W. H. IRVINE,

Deputy of the Governor-General.

Message No. 65.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Deputy of the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

Melbourne, 9th November, 1921.

Ordered-That the foregoing Message be referred to the Committee of Supply forthwith.

5. Supply Resolution—Supply Bill.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

SUPPLY BILL (No. 4) 1921-22.

Resolved, on the motion of Sir Joseph Cook, after debate—That there be granted' to His Majesty for or towards defraying the services of the year 1921-22 a sum not exceeding £2,742,205.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Watkins reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee. F.255.

- 6. Suspension of Standing Orders.—Sir Joseph Cook moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That the Standing Orders be suspended to enable the remaining stages to be passed without delay. Question—put and passed.
- 7. Supply Resolution.—The Resolution reported from the Committee of Supply was read, and, on the motion of Sir Joseph Cook, was adopted by the House.
- 8. Ways and Means Resolution.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

SUPPLY BILL (No. 4) 1921-22.

Resolved, on the motion of Sir Joseph Cook—That, towards making good the Supply granted to His Majesty for the services of the year 1921-22, there be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum not exceeding £2,742,205.

Resolution to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Watkins reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at a later hour this day, again resolve itself into the said Committee. The Resolution reported from the Committee was read, and, on the motion of Sir Joseph Cook, was adopted by the House.

Ordered—That Šir Joseph Cook and Mr. Greene do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.

9. Supply Bill (No. 4) 1921-22.—Sir Joseph Cook then brought up a Bill intituled "A Bill for an Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two," and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Sir Joseph Cook moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Bill agreed to, and to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Watkins reported accordingly.

On the motion of Sir Joseph Cook, the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.
