#### MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY-

We, the House of Representatives of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia, in Parliament assembled, beg to express our loyalty to our Most Gracious Sovereign, and to thank Your Excellency for the Speech which you have been pleased to address to Parliament—

and on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Charlton, viz.:- That the following words be added to the proposed Address in Reply:—

"but we regret that your Advisers have made no provision to liberalize the old-age and invalid pensions"—

Debate resumed.
