- 9. PRIVILEGE.—Mr. Blakeley raised a question of Privilege with regard to a summons in connexion with the Pastoral Strike, with which he had been served in the precincts of Parliament House. Mr. Speaker and Mr. Groom having quoted Parliamentary authorities on the subject, and no motion having been moved, and in view of the fact that the Attorney-General (Mr. Groom) had promised to carefully consider the question, the matter was, for the present, not further proceeded with.
