- 1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.

- 3. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
  War Service Homes Act—Land acquired under, in New South Wales, at Tamworth.
- 4. Public Works Committee (Joint).—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That, in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Public Works Committee Act 1913-1921, the following Members be appointed Members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, viz.:—Mr. Blakeley, Mr. Robert Cook, Mr. Gregory, Mr. Jackson, Mr. Mackay, and Mr. Mathews.

- 6. LIBRARY COMMITTEE. -Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That Mr. Speaker, Mr. Anstey, Mr. Brennan, Mr. Hughes, Sir Elliot Johnson, Mr. Latham, Mr. Maxwell, Mr. Charles McDonald, and Mr. Pratten be Members of the Library Committee; three to form a quorum.

- 7. STANDING ORDERS COMMITTEE.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That Mr. Speaker, the Prime Minister, the Chairman of Committees, Mr. Charlton, Sir Elliot Johnson, Mr. Charles McDonald, and Mr. Earle Page be Members of the Standing Orders Committee; three to form a quorum.

Question—put and passed.

- 8. PRINTING COMMITTEE.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That Mr. Corser, Mr. Fenton, Mr. Roland Green, Mr. Lister, Mr. Edward Riley, Mr. Scullin, and Mr. Thompson be Members of the Printing Committee; three to form a quorum, with power to confer with a similar Committee of the Senate.
  - Question-put and passed.
- 9. House Committee.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That Mr. Speaker, Mr. Cunningham, Mr. Fenton, Mr. R. W. Foster, Mr. Gregory, Mr. Marr, Mr. Prowse, and Mr. Watkins be Members of the House Committee: three to form a quorum.

Debate ensued.
