- 1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Right Honorable W. A. Watt) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Leave of Absence to Members.—(Mr. Charles McDonald and Mr. Yates).—Mr. Anstey. Acting Leader of the Opposition, moved, by leave, That leave of absence for one month be given to the honorable Member for Kennedy (Mr. Charles McDonald) on the ground of ill-health, and to the honorable Member for Adelaide (Mr. Yates) on the ground of urgent public business. Question—put and passed.
- 3. Leave of Absence to Members. -- (Mr. Gibson and Mr. Prowse). -- Mr. Bruce, Prime Minister, moved, by leave, That leave of absence for one month be given to the honorable Member for Corangamite (Mr. Gibson), and to the honorable Member for Forrest (Mr. Prowse), on the ground of urgent public business. Question—put and passed.
- 4. Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works—Report.—Mr. Mackay, for the Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works, brought up the following Report from the Committee-
