- (c) That it should commence at an amount of not less than £200,000, and be reduced by £10,000 annually,

And the question—That the Bill be now read a third time—was accordingly put and passed.—Bill read a third time.

Question of Order.—Speaker's Ruling.—Mr. Gabb having asked Mr. Speaker whether the Temporary Chairman of Committees was in order in accepting a motion in the Committee fixing the limitation of the debate on the third reading of the Bill—

Mr. Speaker stated that the Speaker does not rule as to whether an action by the Chairman is in order, because the Committee of the Whole has control of its own procedure. Mr. Speaker then ruled that a time limit imposed in Committee on the proceedings in the Committee would be regular, but that the Committee could not impose a time limit on the proceedings of the House.

5. Adjournment.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at seventeen minutes to seven o'clock in the morning adjourned until this day at three o'clock p.m.
