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GRAFTON TO SOUTH BRISBANE RAILWAY BILL.—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General. 410. His Excellency's Message considered in Committee, and appropriation agreed to; Standing Orders suspended; and Bill read a first time, 415. Second reading, 425, 445, 462, Amendment (*Mr. Latham*) to withdraw Bill to permit of procedure under Public Works Committee Act, (negatived on division); second reading agreed to, 462. Committee; reported without amendment; report adopted; and Bill read a third time, 462-3. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 494. Assented to, 509. Act No. 54 of 1924.

HOP POOL AGREEMENT BILL.—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General; His Excellency's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to; Standing Orders suspended; Bill brought in and passed through all stages, 295. Agreed to by Senate with an amendment; Senate's amendment agreed to, 317. Assented to, 325. Act No. 9 of 1924.

IMMIGRATION BILL (1923).—Brought from Senate; Bill read a first time, 99. Second reading, 480. Committee, 480, 497-8. Reported with amendments; report, by leave, adopted; and, by leave, Bill read a third time, 498. Senate agrees to Amendment No. 2 of the House and disagrees to Amendment No. 1, 505. Amendment No. 1 not insisted on by House, 505. Assented to, 509. Act No. 47 of 1924.

INCOME TAX BILL (1923).—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means; and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill passed through all stages, 182. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 196. Assented to, 201. Act No. 26 of 1923.

INCOME TAX BILL (1924).—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means; and (Standing Orders having been suspended) Bill passed through all stages, 467. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 473. Assented to, 509. Act No. 50 of 1924.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (1923).—Leave given to bring in Bill, 139. Bill brought in and read a first time, 156. Second reading moved, 160. Considered urgent (on division), 169; time allotted in connexion with the Bill (on division), 169-70. Second reading agreed to (on division), 170-1. Committee, 171, 173-5. Reported with amendments; report adopted; recomittal negatived (on division); and Bill read a third time, 175. Agreed to by Senate with amendments, 195. Senate's amendments agreed to (one with an amendment), 196. Senate agrees to amendment of House upon amendment No. 2 of Senate, 197. Assented to, 201. Act No. 27 of 1923.

INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (1924).—Leave given to bring in Bill, 414. Bill brought in and read a first time, 426. Second reading, 426, 455. Committee, 455-7, 461-2. Reported with amendments; report, by leave, adopted; and, by leave, Bill read a third time, 462. Returned by Senate with amendments, 489. Certain amendments of Senate agreed to; one not agreed to, but, in place thereof, clause 8 amended, 489-90. Senate insists on its amendment not agreed to by the House and disagrees to the amendment of the House in clause 8 in place thereof, 494. House insists on not agreeing to Amendment of the Senate, and insists on the amendment made by the House in clause 8, 503. Senate no longer insists upon its Amendment and agrees to the amendment of the House in clause 8 in place thereof, 506. Assented to, 509. Act No. 51 of 1924.

Second reading; Committee; reported with an amendment; report, by leave, adopted; and, by leave, Bill read a third time, 454. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 469. Assented to, 490. Act No. 33 of 1924.

INCOME TAX COLLECTION BILL.—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 164. His Excellency's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to, 176. Standing Orders suspended; Bill brought in; first reading, 176. Second reading moved, 176. Appropriation recommended by Governor-General for purposes of amendments; His Excellency's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to, 188. Second reading continued; amendment (*Mr. Fenton*) negatived (on division), 188. Second reading agreed to (on division), 189. Committee, 189-90. Reported with amendments; report adopted; and Bill read a third time, 190. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 196. Assented to, 201. Act No. 28 of 1923.

Standing Orders suspended; Bill brought in and read a first time; second reading; Committee, 186. Appropriation recommended by Governor-General for the purposes of an amendment; His Excellency's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to, 187. Committee continued; reported with amendments and an amended Title; report adopted and Bill read a third time, 187. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 197. Assented to, 201. Act No. 15 of 1923.
