Monday 16 September 2002

The Senate met from 12.30pm until 10.29pm

Senate vacancy

Resignation of Senator Herron

The President announced the resignation, on 5 September 2002, of Senator Herron and advised the Senate that, pursuant to section 21 of the Constitution, the Governor-General had notified the Governor of Queensland that there was a vacancy in the representation of that state

Proceeds of Crime Bill 2002 and Proceeds of Crime (Consequential Amendments and Transitional Provisions) Bill 2002–second reading debate continued [a <u>second reading amendment</u> on a matter of policy moved by the Opposition is to be determined]

Regulations disallowed

The Senate *agreed to disallow* <u>various regulations</u> made under the *Corporations Act* 2001

The Senate debated a motion to disallow Regulation 9A.20–Wildlife trade operations and management plans, in item [2] of Schedule 1 of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment Regulations 2001 (No. 3), as contained in Statutory Rules 2001 No. 327 and made under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* and the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment (Wildlife Protection) Act 2001*. The Senate agreed *not* to disallow the regulation.

Motion agreed to

The Senate agreed to <u>a motion</u> without debate about the Specific Learning Difficulties Association of New South Wales—moved by Senator Allison

Motion defeated

An <u>urgency motion</u> moved by Senator Brown relating to human rights in China and Tibet was defeated

Motion debated

The Senate debated a <u>motion</u>, moved by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasurer, that the order of the Senate of 25 March 1999 relating to an order for the production of periodic reports by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission on private health insurance, be amended to vary the reporting requirements. Debate adjourned.

Statement by Parliamentary Secretary

The Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasurer made a <u>statement</u> relating to the order of the Senate of 21 August 2002 for the production of documents concerning financial information on higher education institutions. Senators <u>Campbell</u>, <u>Carr</u>, <u>Faulkner</u>, <u>Ludwig</u> and <u>Mackay</u> also made statements relating to the matter
