## Orders for the production of documents

#### Legislation postponed

The Senate agreed to postpone further consideration of the Customs Tariff Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2003 and the Excise Tariff Amendment Bill (No. 1) 2003 until the order for the production of documents relating to a proposed excise and production subsidy is complied with (order agreed to 16 October 2002)

#### Statement by Minister

The Minister for Family and Community Services made <u>a statement</u> relating to the order of the Senate (agreed to <u>25 June 2003</u>) for the production of documents concerning works undertaken by the public relations company Turnbull Porter Novelli for Biotechnology Australia. The Minister indicated that the documents would be tabled within the next three weeks.
