The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.24pm

Qualification of a senator

The Senate agreed to a motion to engage Queen's Counsel to advise on certain matters brought to the attention of the President by Senator Scullion which may have put him in conflict with section 44(v) of the Constitution

Motions agreed to

The Senate agreed to motions about:

- □ Iranian asylum seekers—moved by Senator Nettle
- Parliamentary zone—capital works within the Parliamentary Zone for the installation of a commemorative plaque to the victims of the Bali atrocity in the northern hedged room of the Formal Gardens of the Parliamentary Precincts. Documents relating to the installation were also tabled.

The Senate also debated and agreed to <u>an urgency motion</u> about the rights of Indigenous children–moved by <u>Senator Ridgeway</u>

The Senate debated <u>a motion</u> moved by <u>Senator McLucas</u> about Australia's health system

Motions defeated

A <u>motion</u> moved by Senator Nettle about the funding of public education was defeated

The Minister for Revenue and Assistant Treasurer made a statement about the motion requiring certain details to be provided to the Senate about a shipment of sheep on the *Cormo Express* (by 3pm on 18 September 2003)—moved by Senator Bartlett. The Minister indicated that detailed information would not be provided to the Senate until the matter has been resolved.
