Motion to disallow defeated

The Senate debated a motion to disallow items [2] to [6] of Schedule 1 of the Migration Agents Amendment Regulations 2003 (No. 1) as contained in Statutory Rules 2003 No. 92 and made under the *Migration Act 1958*. The Senate agreed *not* to disallow the items.
