The Senate noted that the government had not responded to the order of the Senate concerning the government's consideration of an ethanol excise and production subsidy (<u>agreed to 16 October 2002</u>) and <u>agreed</u> to call on the government to comply with the order (no later than 5pm on 27 March 2003)

### Statement by Minister

The Minister for Revenue and Assistant Treasurer made a <u>statement</u> relating to the order of the Senate of <u>25 March 2003</u> for the production of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Australian Government and the Islamic Republic of Iran. The Minister indicated that it was not in the public interest for the government to comply with the order. The Senate took note of the statement.
