## Orders for the production of documents

#### Motion agreed to

The Senate ordered the Minister for Finance and Administration to table the document containing the Commonwealth sites, including offshore islands and territories, listed as potential sites for the storage of nuclear waste and referred to by the Minister on the Australian Broadcasting Corporation's *AM Program* on 14 July 2004 (no later than 1pm on 12 August 2004)–moved by Senator Allison

#### Statement by Minister

The Minister for the Environment and Heritage made <u>a statement</u> relating to the order of the Senate [agreed to on <u>10 August 2004</u>] requiring the tabling of certain correspondence and other communications concerning Repulse Bay, the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority or the Representative Areas Program (no later than 3pm on 11 August 2004). The Minister indicated the documents would be tabled. Senator McLucas made <u>a statement</u> relating to the matter.
